- Before any company can build a "major utility facility," the OPSB assures that it benefits Ohio's citizens, promotes the state's economic interests, and protects the environment and land use.
- Public and local government participation are strongly encouraged.
- If approved, the OPSB issues a certificate for the construction, operation, and maintenance of the facility.

Solar farm map




Power Siting Solar Case Status

The estimated project size is shown in acres. Pre-Application project locations, capacity, and acreage may be approximated. Public participation

Public informational meeting

Developer educates community about project and gathers input to consider in developing its application. OPSB representatives provide info about siting process and public participation.

Public comments

Written comments are filed in the case where they inform the Board members and staff. Comments are accepted at any time after a case number is established.

Local public hearing

Board obtains sworn statements from the public which are transcribed and become part of the official record that the Board considers before making its decision.

Held at least 15 days after staff publishes its report of investigation. Notification letters sent to property owners and local officials. Newspaper notice 7-21 before the hearing.

Adjudicatory hearing

The developer, OPSB staff, and parties to the case present testimony and evidence regarding the facility and cross examine each other. **Intervention** grants individuals and local governments the right to participate as a party in the adjudicatory hearing, file for rehearing, or appeal to the Supreme Court of Ohio.

Held approximately 2 weeks after the local public hearing. Property owners and local officials receive letters advising them of right to intervene.

Ad hoc members

- For all applications or material amendments that have not been deemed complete by the effective date of SB 52 (October 11, 2021), the OPSB will include two voting ad hoc members.
 - 1. A representative of the boards of township trustees located in the proposed project area
 - 2. A representative of the boards of county commissioners located in the proposed project area.
- Ad hoc members will be designated by the local government boards within 30 days of notice of application completion.

Board decision

The OPSB must find and determine eight criteria:

- 1. For electric transmission and gas pipelines, the basis of need.
- 2. The nature of the probable environmental impact.
- 3. Whether the facility represents the minimum adverse environmental impact.
- 4. That the facility is consistent with regional plans for expansion of the electric power grid serving.
- 5. That the facility will comply with air and water pollution and solid waste disposal laws as well as air navigation rules and standards.
- 6. That the facility will serve the public interest, convenience, and necessity.
- 7. The facility's impact on the continued agricultural viability of land in an existing agricultural district.
- 8. That the facility incorporates maximum feasible water conservation practices.



Construction & operation

If a project is approved, the OPSB monitors construction and operation to ensure compliance with the certificate and any conditions.

- The developer must establish a complaint resolution process to address concerns resulting from project construction and operation.
- The developer must obtain all required transportation permits and coordinate with the appropriate authority regarding temporary road closures and access restrictions, road use agreements, and traffic control.
- The developer must avoid and minimize damage to field tile drainage systems and soils, and repair or replace damaged field tiles.
- At least 60 days prior to construction, the developer must submit a decommissioning plan, prepared by a
 registered engineer, to the OPSB for review. The plan must include the parties responsible for
 decommissioning, a schedule of decommissioning activities, and an estimate of decommissioning costs, which
 must be recalculated every five years.
- The developer must post a performance bond to ensure funds are available for decommissioning and the bond must be adjusted every five years. The bond shall never decrease even if the estimated costs decrease.

- Opportunity for OPSB to receive feedback from interested stakeholders and the public before draft rules are issued for comment.
- OPSB is considering implementing a rule that is specific to applications for electric generation facilities associated with solar panels.
